




I, Stanley Jurgielewicz, willingly submit the following statement and certify. that it is the truth to the best of my knowledge.

On the evening of 12/14/2011 we had a potential client, Reuben Miller, who came to us for a ETOH [alcohol] Detox. When the client arrived I administered a BAC [blood alcohol test]; which was .380 I let the admitting nurse know what the level was. At this time the client Reuben Miller was very upset and emotional, he did not want to come into the detox and begged his girlfriend to take him home. His girlfriend insisted that he needed help or go to the hospital and that she would not take him home. At this time the admitting nurse, Anne Crane, placed a phone call to 911 stating we have a potential client who needs to go to the hospital and asked for an ambulance and police officer to come. After the call was placed we were outside with the client, and he was telling his girlfriend to take him home. Then the ambulance arrived, they asked if Reuben wanted to go to the hospital and he refused saying he wanted to go home. He turned around and continued to talk to his girlfriend, facing away from our driveway, when the first police officer arrived. Immediately running out of his vehicle the officer grabbed Reuben Miller from behind and threw him to the ground. At no point did the first officer identify himself as a police officer or confront Reuben to place his hands behind his back. A second officer arrived soon after and proceeded to join in the situation by punching Reuben in the face multiple times. While he was hand cuffed on the ground the second officer began to pick-up Reuben's head and smash it to the ground multiple times. Two more officers showed up to the scene, spraying him in the face with mace and yelling at Reuben. Throughout this whole ordeal the two ambulance personal's faces seemed in utter shock to what was happening to Reuben. After Reuben was detained the admitting nurse, Anne Crane, was crying and stated to the officers that he needed to go to the hospital, but they commented back saying he was being placed under arrest. The Sergeant arrived to the scene and the first officer talked to the sergeant and stated that Reuben was attacking his girlfriend when he arrived. At no time was Reuben a threat to his girlfriend, Anne Crane or myself. The fire chief next arrived at the scene and stated he has had multiple conversations with Jack Malone and the State Attorney's office about how this type of behavior is allowed

because someone is intoxicated. At this time they took Reuben Miller to jail without any medical attention. To this day I cannot get the horrific images or sounds of that night out of my head and I will carry this with me forever. No human being should ever be treated the way Reuben was treated tonight.
